#### Chairman's Letter

#### Dear Members

I am pleased to report that yet again the operations in the financial year 2008-09 have resulted in record financial results. The impressive results are largely on account of significant contribution from power generation and improved sugar price realization as well

The sugar industry can play a major role in the economic growth of the nation. In the integrated sugar projects, ECO friendly Ethanol and Power are produced contributing to reduction in global warming. If Ethanol production can be substantially increased valuable foreign exchange can be saved. The increase in power production will benefit the overall industrial growth of the country

The above positive results are possible if only the coverage of cane cultivation is increased with adequate price compensation to the cane growers and market driven price realization for sugar. Both Central and State Governments must play proactive role in encouraging the sugar industry in the overall interest of the nation

It is not out of place for me to mention that a large share of sugar produced is consumed by MNCs for production of soft drinks and by other sweet makers. The direct public consumption of sugar is only 30% of total production. By artificially controlling the price of sugar, the Government is only helping the MNCs and sweet makers at the expense of industry and cane growers

The prices of various food items of daily consumption like rice, wheat, maize, cereals, onion, potato etc. have risen over the last one year in the range of 25% to 100%, whereas the sugar price has not increased adequately. It is also pertinent to state that sugar price in India is the lowest in the world

In the backdrop, the Government needs to consider and take the following initiatives to strengthen sugar industry which can play a significant role in the economic growth of the nation:

> Capital incentives need to be provided to the new integrated plants which produce Sugar, Ethanol and Power



- > Sugar has to be allowed to be sold without release restrictions
- > The levy price is to be revised to cover cost of production and a fair return on capital
- > A free inter-state movement of Ethanol and interstate supply of co-generation power must be ensured
- Sugar factories may be allowed to produce Jaggery, Gur etc., without the burden of taxes
- > The State levies on purchase and sales of raw material and finished products must be removed or atleast made uniform among the States
- > Mechanization in cane harvesting must be encouraged by subsidizing the cost of harvesting machines

I am confident that the Government would do the needful for the sugar industry which is the second largest in India next to Textiles

I wish to state that our new sugar factory and cogeneration plant at Tirvannamalai will be in operation from 2009-10 sugar season. I am confident that all our plans towards new projects over the coming years will be successfully implemented for a sustained growth

I would like to thank immensely our cane growers, bankers, Central and State Governments and our dedicated employees for their continued cooperation and support

#### Co-generation of Power

The co-generation plant of sugar unit in Tamilnadu had generated 103.52 million units of power and exported 70.42 million units to Tamilnadu Government Grid. The 16 MW co-generation plant of the sugar unit in Alaganchi Village, Karnataka had generated 86.82 million units of power and exported 50.03 million units to Karnataka Government Grid. The 20 MW co-generation plant in the location had generated 94.25 million units of power and exported 43.73 million units to Tata Power Corporation Limited under third party sale and 22.05 million units to Karnataka Government Grid.

#### **Distillery Division**

The distillery in Tamilnadu had worked for 348 days and produced 19.99 lakh BLtrs of Rectified Spirit and 154.68 lakh BLtrs of Neutral Spirit

The distillery in Karnataka had worked for 176 days and produced 1.75 lakh BLtrs of Rectified Spirit, 75.30 lakh BLtrs of Neutral Spirit and 2.26 lakh BLtrs of Medium Grade Alcohol

#### **Granite Division**

In Granite Polishing unit in Tamilnadu 93575 square metres of Granite slabs and 13488 square metres of tiles were produced compared to production of 128481 square metres of Granite Slabs and 7669 square metres of tiles in the last year. Production of monuments has been suspended due to unfavourable market condition

#### Wind Mill

Wind mills had generated 15.12 million units of power and exported 13.33 million units to Tamilnadu Government Grid as against the generation of 15.84 million units and export of 13.67 million units of power in the previous year

#### Redemption of 1846000 – 9% Redeemable Non-Cumulative Preference Shares

The company has redeemed 1846000 - 9% Redeemable Non-Cumulative Preference Shares allotted under the Scheme of Amalgamation on 31.3.2009



#### Prospects for the Current year 2009 - 2010

It is estimated to crush 5.5 lakh tonnes of sugarcane in sugar unit in Tamilnadu. About 10 lakh tonnes of Sugarcane is expected for crush in sugar unit at Alaganchi Village in Karnataka including cane available in the Kollegal Sugar Unit area as the sugarcane in those areas is limited due to drought and remunerative prices for other crops. It is estimated to produce 180 Lakh BLtrs of spirit in the distillery unit in Tamilnadu and 150 Lakh BLtrs of spirit in distillery unit in Karnataka

The establishment of integrated sugar complex at Kolundampattu Village Thandarampattu Taluk Tiruvannamalai District in the State of Tamilnadu is in advanced stage and the factory is expected to commence its operation from the last quarter of current financial year

#### A. Conservation of Energy

- (a) Energy conservation measures taken
  - Vapour Absorption Machines (VAM) have been installed for eliminating the usage of compressor based air condition machines and emission of Chloro Fluro Carbon (CFC)
  - Compressed air system has been changed to operate in Variable Frequency Drive (VFD) mode instead of existing Direct On-Line (DOL) Mode.
  - Conventional method of weighing and pumping of final molasses has been eliminated by mass flow metering system
  - Waste hot water handling (Recycling and pumping) System has been modified to eliminate re-circulation.
  - Capacity utilization of pumps has been optimized by replacing the lower rating low efficient centrifugal pumps with energy efficient screw pumps in centrifugal section.
- (b) Additional investment/proposal, if any, being implemented for reduction of consumption of energy:
  - Harmonic Filters are proposed to be installed in Converter Transformer to minimize harmonic existence and failure of electrical utilities.
- (c) Impact of measures (a) and (b) above for reduction of energy consumption and consequent impact on the cost of production of goods:
  - The approximate energy saving would be 2700 units/per day.
  - Minimizing harmonic distortion would minimize failure of electrical utilities.

#### Management Discussion and Analysis Report

#### **Industry Structure and Development**

The Indian sugar industry is one of the largest agro based industry. It has significant standing in the world sugar market. The industry is regulated by the Central/State Governments by means of mandated command area, formula based pricing, monthly release mechanism, import-export policy, levy: free sugar policy etc.

The Indian sugar production during the current season 2008-2009 is expected to be 145-150 lakh tonnes as against the estimated domestic consumption of 220-225 lakh tonnes. It is estimated that in the next sugar season also India's sugar production would fall short of domestic consumption. The expected shortfall in production prompted the Government to allow the import of white sugar/raw sugar.

The Indian sugar industry is one of the most diversified industry. It has the capacity to produce 2500 million litres of alcohol/ethanol and 7000 MW power. The industry is key contributor to renewable sources of energy.

#### **Opportunities and Outlook**

Due to shortfall in domestic sugar production, Sugar prices are expected to improve further and revenue from byproducts viz. co-generation of power, alcohol, ethanol etc is also expected to improve.

#### **Threats Risks & Concerns**

Sugar industry is subject to various uncertainties viz availability of sugarcane, support prices announced by the Central/State Governments for agricultural commodities, diversion of sugarcane to alternate sweeteners, importexport policies, availability of labour etc.

#### SCHEDULE 19

#### NOTES ATTACHED TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st MARCH 2009

#### I. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- Fixed Assets: The Fixed Assets are valued at Cost. Cost includes related taxes, duties, freight, insurance 1. etc., attributable to acquisition and installation of assets and borrowing cost incurred up to the date of commencing operations but excludes duties and taxes that are recoverable from taxing authorities.
- 2. Investments: Investments are accounted at cost. The diminution in the market value of investments is recognized when diminution is considered permanent.
- 3. Depreciation: Straight line method has been adopted for providing depreciation on fixed assets as per the rates prescribed in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act 1956 other than for Co-Generation Division and Wind Energy Division. For the assets of Co-Generation Division and Wind Energy Division depreciation has been provided under written down value method as per the rates prescribed in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956. For additions and deletions depreciation is provided from date of addition/deletion on pro-rata basis. Depreciation on asset additions costing Rs.5000/- or less is provided at the rate of 100%.

- (ii) The cost for the finished goods and process stock is inclusive of cost of purchase, cost of conversion and other costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition
- 5. Revenue Recognition: All Income and Expenses are accounted on accrual basis. The turnover is accounted without considering inter-division transfers for own consumption.
- Foreign Currency Transactions: Foreign currency transactions are recorded at the exchange rate prevailing 6. on the date of the transaction. Foreign currency monetary items as at the balance sheet date are reported using the closing rate or at the rate that is likely to be realised from / required to disburse. The gain or loss due to increase or decrease in value of reporting currency due to fluctuations in rates of exchange are recognized in the profit and loss account.
- 7. Contingent liabilities are disclosed by way of notes attached to and forming part of the Balance Sheet.
- 8. Impairment of assets if any, are recognised and given effect to in the Accounts.
- 9. Gratuity liability to the Employees on actuarial basis has been accounted in full. The Company has opted for Life Insurance Corporation of India Group Gratuity Scheme and premium demanded by LIC upto 31.3.2009 has been accounted for.
- 10. Current tax is determined at the current rates of Income Tax on taxable income and tax credits are computed in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961. Fringe benefit tax provision is made accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
- Deferred tax is recognized on timing difference between the accounting income and the taxable income for the year and quantified using the tax rates and laws that have been substantially enacted as at the balance sheet date. The deferred tax assets are recognized and carried forward to the extent that there is a reasonable certainty that these would be realized in future.
- Government grants are recognized based on the reasonable assurance that the Company will comply with the conditions attached to the grants and the grants will be received. Government grant in the nature of revenue has been recognized on a systematic basis in the profit and loss account over the periods necessary to match them with the related costs which they are intended to compensate and the grants have been adjusted against the related expenses.
- The segment reporting is in line with the accounting policies of the Company. Inter segment transactions have been accounted for, based on the price which has been arrived at considering cost and market price. Revenue and expenses that are directly identifiable with or allocable to segments are considered for determining the segment results. Segment assets and liabilities include those directly identifiable with the respective segments. Business segments are identified on the basis of the nature of products, the risk/return profile of individual business, the organizational structure and the internal reporting system of the Company.
- 14. The Company's significant leasing arrangements are operating leases and cancellable in nature. The lease rentals paid/received under such agreements are accounted in the profit and loss account.
- Employee benefits: Provident Fund/Pension Fund and Gratuity liability are defined contribution schemes and contributions are charged to profit and loss account of the year in which the contributions to the respective funds are due. Short term employee benefits including accumulated compensated absences are provided for, based on the expected obligation on an undiscounted basis.
- The Excise Duty on sale of finished goods is deducted from turnover to arrive at net sales as shown in the profit and loss account. The Excise Duty appearing in the profit and loss account as an expenditure represents excise duty provision for difference between opening and closing stock of finished goods.
- 17. Borrowing cost which are directly attributable to the construction of qualifying assets are capitalised as a part of the cost of the asset.
